

Wraparound is a team-based planning process that serves youth and their families who are struggling with emotional, mental and/ or behavioral health challenges.

How Long? On average, the Wraparound process takes 6–18 months from start to finish. The team meets an average of once per month.

What Will We Be Doing? The Wraparound process begins by learning about a youth and family's strengths and needs, and then working together to create a plan to meet their needs. It ends when the Team Mission is met.

Who Can Receive Wraparound Support? Wraparound is available to Clackamas County residents who:

- Are 0–17 years old at the time of referral
- Want to participate in the Wraparound process
- Are enrolled in the Oregon Health Plan (OHP) and assigned to a Coordinated Care Organization (CCO) such as Health Share/Care Oregon or Trillium Health Plans
- Are involved in two or more child-serving systems (Mental Health, Special Education, Juvenile Justice, Child Protective Services/DHS, etc)
- Priority is given to youth who are currently in Psychiatric Residential Treatment, State Hospital, or a residential program for Commercially Sexually Exploited Children

Who is Involved?

Wraparound brings together a team of people who are involved in the youth and family's life. The team might include:

- Friends
- Relatives
- Teachers
- Mental Health Therapists
- Child Welfare caseworkers
- Developmental Disabilities Service Coordinators
- Juvenile Court Counselors
- and more.
